## 1. Registration and Administrative Procedures

- **Registration:** Within two weeks of your arrival, you must register at the Essen Residents' Registration Office. It's best to schedule an appointment online at the local citizens' office to avoid waiting times.

- **Foreigners' Office:** Responsible for residence permits, work permits, and visa inquiries in Essen. Schedule an appointment in advance as demand can be high.

Address: Schederhofstr. 45, 45145 Essen, Phone: 0201 8838883

- **Language Courses:** There are many opportunities to learn German. The Essen Adult Education Center (Volkshochschule Essen, VHS) offers integration and German language courses, as well as some non-profit organizations.

## 2. Housing and Apartment Search

- **Apartment Search:** Compared to other major German cities, rents in Essen are still relatively affordable, but demand is high. Good neighborhoods for families include Rütterscheid, Kettwig, and Bredeney, while Frohnhausen and Steele often offer more affordable rental options.

- **Housing Benefits:** If your income is low, you may be eligible for housing benefits. Information can be obtained from the Essen Office for Social Affairs and Housing.

## 3. Work and Education

- **Job Opportunities:** The Essen Job Center and the Employment Agency assist with job searches. The Ruhr area offers many job opportunities, especially in industries such as manufacturing, logistics, and services.
- **Recognition of Qualifications:** If you have qualifications from your home country, they may be recognized in Germany. The Chamber of Commerce and Industry (IHK) and the IQ Network can assist with the recognition of qualifications and job search.
- **Career Orientation and Further Education:** The Essen Adult Education Center offers numerous courses for professional development.

## 4. Schools and Education

- **School System:** Children aged 6 to 18 must attend school in Germany. There are primary schools, secondary schools, and various types of schools such as Gymnasium, comprehensive schools, and Realschule.
- **German Language Support:** Schools offer special German language support courses for children learning German as a second language. Contact your child's school to find out what programs are available.
- **Kindergarten Spots:** Children under six years can be cared for in a daycare center or by a day-care mother. Kindergarten spots are highly sought after, so it is advisable to register early.



## 5. Healthcare System

- **Health Insurance:** Health insurance is mandatory in Germany. There are both statutory and private health insurance options. If you are unemployed, the Jobcenter may cover the costs.
- **General Practitioner and Specialist:** In Germany, you typically need a general practitioner who will refer you to specialists if necessary. General practitioners are available in all districts.
- **Emergency Numbers:** In case of emergency, you can dial the emergency number 112.
- For medical advice in urgent but non-life-threatening situations, dial 116 117.

## 6. Banking and Finance

- **Opening a Bank Account:** A bank account is essential for receiving your salary and making payments. Banks like Sparkasse Essen, Deutsche Bank, or online banks offer various account models.
- **Financial Advice:** Organizations such as the Consumer Advice Center of North Rhine Westphalia (Verbraucherzentrale NRW) can assist with queries about financial products, contracts, or debt counseling.

## 7. Mobility and Public Transport

- **Transport Network:** The Rhine-Ruhr Transport Association (VRR) manages the public transport network. With a monthly ticket, you can use trains and buses unlimitedly in Essen and throughout the Ruhr area.
- **Bicycle Friendliness:** Essen is increasingly expanding its network of bicycle paths. There are numerous bicycle rental stations, such as those from Nextbike.
- **Car and Driving License:** Depending on your country of origin, you can use your driving license in Germany or you may need to have it converted. More information can be obtained from the Essen driving license office.

## 8. Culture and Leisure

- **Cultural Diversity:** Essen is a multicultural city offering numerous international restaurants, markets, and shops. Rüttenscheid is a popular spot for those looking to go out, featuring international cuisine and events.

## 9. Playgrounds

### Grugapark Playground

*Location:* Grugapark, Alfredstraße 61, 45131 Essen

**Description:** This large playground in Grugapark offers a variety of options for children of all ages, including climbing frames, swings, slides, and a zip line. Additionally, the park features many animals, a petting zoo, a children's farm, and water play areas in the summer.

**Highlights:** Extensive climbing landscapes, numerous play equipment, direct access to park facilities, and nearby cafés for parents.

### Seaside Beach Baldeney

*Location:* Freiherr-vom-Stein-Straße 384, 45133 Essen

**Description:** Located by Lake Baldeney, this beach playground offers a sandy play area. Children can play in the sand while parents enjoy the beautiful lake views. The site also offers many recreational activities such as beach volleyball and water sports.

**Highlights:** Beachfront playground with lake views, options for picnics and outings, ideal for a day trip.

### Kaiser-Wilhelm Park Playground

*Location:* Kaiser-Wilhelm Park, in the Altenessen district

**Description:** The playground in Kaiser-Wilhelm Park is very large and has numerous play devices suitable for various age groups. It includes climbing structures, slides, swings, and ample space for romping.

**Highlights:** Diverse play equipment, large green spaces, suitable for family outings and picnics.

### Hugo Kükelhaus Park

ATTRACTIONS IN ESSEN  
**Zollverein Coal Mine, Essen**



The Zollverein Coal Mine in Essen is an iconic symbol of the industrial heritage in the Ruhr area and is today one of the most famous industrial monuments in the world. Since 2001, this former coal mine has been part of the UNESCO World Heritage Site and attracts numerous visitors annually. Known as the "most beautiful coal mine in the world," Zollverein fascinatingly combines history, culture, and modern design.

**Historical Significance** Founded in 1847, the mine played a central role in Germany's coal and steel industry for over 135 years. The main complex, Shaft 12, was completed in 1932 in a Bauhaus-inspired style and is considered a masterpiece of modern industrial architecture. The imposing double-bock winding tower, the mine's landmark, remains a symbol of the Ruhr area today.

**Structural Transformation** With the closure of the mine in 1986 began the transformation of the entire site. What was once a place of hard work and heavy machinery has gradually been converted into a vibrant cultural and creative center. Today, Zollverein is a prime example of structural change in the Ruhr area and demonstrates how industrial culture can be reinterpreted.

**Art and Culture** The site now houses museums, galleries, theaters, and event spaces. Particularly noteworthy is the Ruhr Museum, located in the former coal washing plant, which offers an exciting exhibition on the natural, cultural, and social history of the Ruhr area. The Red Dot Design Museum is also located here, showcasing exceptional product design from around the world across 4,000 square meters.

**Leisure and Recreation** Zollverein is not only a place for culture but also for leisure and recreation. The extensive green spaces and impressive architecture invite visitors to stroll around. In summer, the Werksschwimmbad open-air pool offers a chance to cool off and provides a unique swimming experience amid the old industrial facilities. In winter, the coke plant square transforms into a charming ice rink, set against the backdrop of historic buildings.

**Tours and Events** Tours at Zollverein provide fascinating insights into the history of mining, the daily work of miners, and the technical aspects of coal production. There are various tours available, including special ones for families and children. Furthermore, Zollverein hosts events throughout the year such as concerts, festivals, and art installations that continually revitalize the site.

**Getting There and Visiting** Zollverein is easily accessible by public transport and is only a few kilometers from Essen city center. Entry to the site is free, but fees apply for visiting the museums and special exhibitions. Zollverein is more than just a monument – it is a lively place that embodies the history, transformation, and future of the Ruhr area. Whether interested in history, art, or leisure, a visit to the Zollverein Coal Mine is a must for anyone wanting to experience the Ruhr area and its unique industrial culture.



## Essen Cathedral and Cathedral Treasury




The Essen Cathedral, officially known as Essen Minster, is the religious and historical heart of the city and one of the most significant landmarks in Essen. Located centrally at Burgplatz, it impressively combines medieval history with modern church life. The origins of the cathedral date back to the 9th century when it was founded as a convent church for the then significant Essen Abbey. Today, the cathedral shapes the Essen skyline and attracts visitors from around the world.

**Architecture and Construction History** Essen Cathedral is a striking example of early medieval church architecture that has evolved over the centuries. The oldest parts date back to the Ottonian period, which dates to the 10th century. The cathedral combines different architectural styles—from Romanesque and Gothic elements to modern extensions like the West Crypt completed in 1958. The Westwork and the mighty octagonal bell tower are characteristic features and shape the cathedral's external appearance.

**The Cathedral Treasury** A special highlight for visitors is the famous Essen Cathedral Treasury, one of the most significant church treasuries in Germany and a masterpiece of sacred art. The treasury is kept in the adjacent Cathedral Treasury Museum and includes an exceptional collection of medieval goldsmith art and relics, some over 1,000 years old. The Golden Madonna, known as the oldest full-sculptural figure of Mary in the world, stands out as one of the most precious artworks of the early Middle Ages. Other treasures include the Cross of Otto Mathilde, the Essen Sword, and precious reliquary busts.





**Spiritual Center and Art in the Cathedral** Essen Cathedral is not just a historical monument but also a vibrant place of faith. As the bishop's seat of the Diocese of Essen, it is the center of the Catholic Church in the Ruhr area. The light-filled interior, the artfully decorated windows, and the historic tomb slabs invite visitors for a moment of quiet reflection. Modern artworks and sacred objects, such as the famous altar cross and the Gothic candelabra, blend old and new elements creating a special atmosphere.

**Tours and Events** Visitors can explore the cathedral and the treasury on guided tours that offer fascinating insights into the history, architecture, and symbolic art. In addition to regular tours, the cathedral also hosts regular services, concerts, and cultural events. The organ concerts, in particular, are an acoustic experience and attract music enthusiasts to the cathedral.

**Location and Visit Information** The cathedral is located in the heart of Essen and is easily accessible by public transport. Entrance to the cathedral is free, but there is a small fee for visiting the treasury. The cathedral and the Cathedral Treasury Museum are open most weekdays, but exact opening hours may vary seasonally.

# Museum Folkwang



The Museum Folkwang in Essen is one of the most prestigious art museums in Germany and a true treasure for art lovers. It boasts an impressive collection of modern and contemporary art as well as works from the classical modern period, making it a cultural highlight of the Ruhr area. The museum is centrally located in Essen's Südviertel and attracts numerous visitors annually who come to experience the high-quality works and impressive architecture.

## History and Architecture

Founded in 1902 by collector Karl Ernst Osthaus in Hagen and relocated to Essen in 1922, the Museum Folkwang quickly established itself as an important center for modern art. The current museum building, opened in 2010, was designed by British architect David Chipperfield. Its open and light-flooded architecture impresses with its clean lines and spacious exhibition areas, creating a harmonious connection between art and architecture and inviting visitors to enjoy a relaxed tour.



**The Collection** The Museum Folkwang's collection spans a wide range of artworks from the Romantic period to the present. It is particularly renowned for its classical modern art works, including masterpieces by Vincent van Gogh, Paul Cézanne, Claude Monet, Edvard Munch, and Pablo Picasso. The collection also focuses on the German and French Expressionist movements, featuring works by Ernst Ludwig Kirchner, Emil Nolde, and other artists from the Brücke and Blaue Reiter groups.

In addition to painting, the Museum Folkwang offers outstanding collections in photography, graphic art, and sculpture. Its photography collection is among the most significant in Europe and includes works by internationally renowned photographers.

**Special Exhibitions and Events** Beyond the permanent exhibition, the museum regularly hosts high-quality special exhibitions that highlight particular aspects of art history or feature contemporary artists. These exhibitions introduce new perspectives and add a dynamic quality to the museum. Additionally, the Museum Folkwang organizes workshops, lectures, guided tours, and movie nights that enhance its cultural offerings and appeal to a wide audience.



**Visitor Friendliness and Facilities** The Museum Folkwang is committed to ensuring a pleasant visitor experience. It features barrier-free access and includes a café overlooking the greened courtyard, perfect for a stylish break. There is also a museum shop where visitors can purchase art books, replicas, and design items.

**Arrival and Visitor Information** The Museum Folkwang is easily accessible by public transport and is just a few minutes away from Essen's central train station. Entry to the permanent exhibition is free, although there may be a fee for special exhibitions. Opening hours vary seasonally, so checking the website before visiting is recommended.

The Museum Folkwang is a cultural magnet in Essen and a must-visit for anyone interested in art. With its impressive collection and modern, bright architecture, it is a place where art can be enjoyed in a relaxed manner and presents the richness of European and modern art impressively.

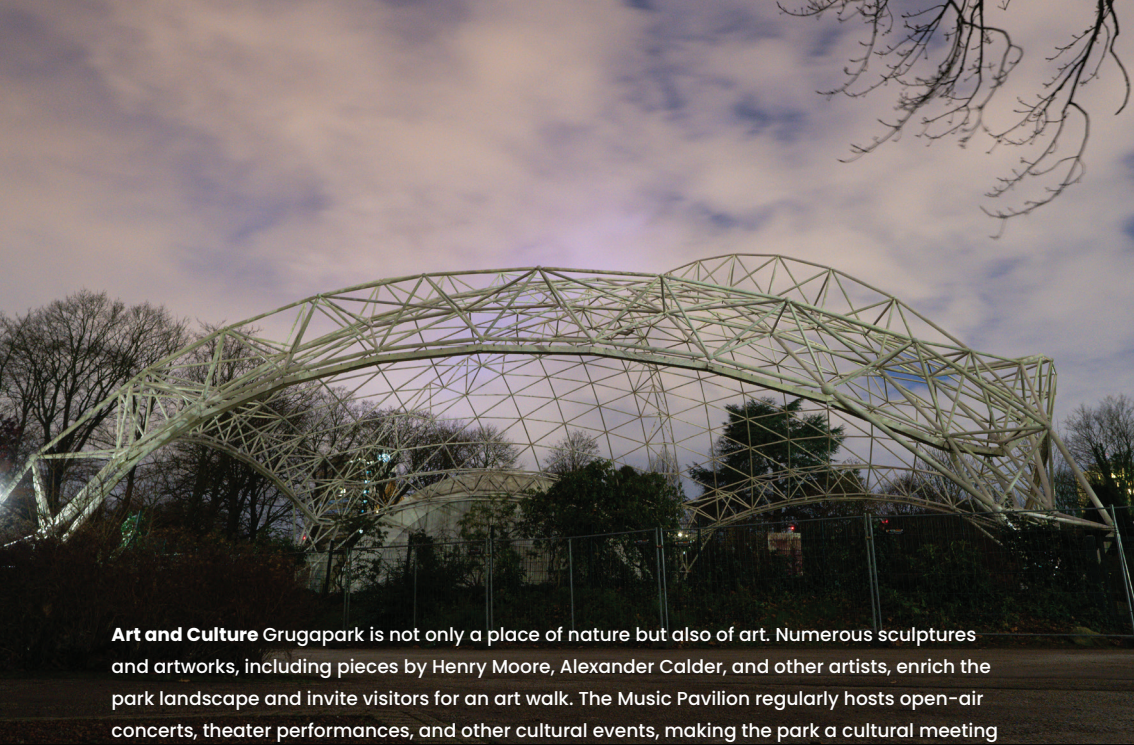


## Grugapark

Grugapark is the green oasis of Essen and one of the most beautiful landscape parks in the Ruhr area. Spanning 60 hectares in the Rüttenscheid district, it is a popular destination for those seeking relaxation as well as nature and garden enthusiasts. Opened in 1929 for the first Great Ruhr Horticultural Show (GRUGA), Grugapark combines idyllic park landscapes, theme gardens, artworks, and leisure facilities, welcoming visitors throughout the year.

**Nature and Theme Gardens** Grugapark is renowned for its beautifully designed theme gardens that showcase plant diversity from around the world. Highlights include the Japanese Garden, which radiates a special tranquility with its Far Eastern design, and the Mediterranean Flair, where olive trees and cypresses create a southern atmosphere. In the Rhododendron Valley, visitors can enjoy the flowering of these magnificent plants in spring, while the Dahlia Arena shines in all colors in summer. There is also a fascinating Alpine garden, a perennial slope, and a Botanical Garden with exotic plants.

**Animals and Nature** Experience Grugapark is home to a variety of animals, including birds, goats, and alpacas. The Bird Flight Hall is a highlight for animal lovers, where native and exotic birds can be observed up close. The wildlife area with native wild animals is also a hit with both young and old visitors. The aquarium and terrarium area, as well as the beehive, offer further exciting insights into the animal kingdom.



**Art and Culture** Grugapark is not only a place of nature but also of art. Numerous sculptures and artworks, including pieces by Henry Moore, Alexander Calder, and other artists, enrich the park landscape and invite visitors for an art walk. The Music Pavilion regularly hosts open-air concerts, theater performances, and other cultural events, making the park a cultural meeting point.

**Leisure Activities and Relaxation** Grugapark offers numerous leisure opportunities for visitors of all ages. The spacious lawns and numerous benches are perfect for relaxing, while the playgrounds, including the large adventure playground, are very popular with children. Sports enthusiasts can try out the Kneipp water treading pool or jog and walk along the park's trails. The Gruga area for children, with small climbing walls and play equipment, ensures variety. Especially noteworthy is the Grugabad, a large outdoor swimming pool next to the park, which provides cooling in the summer and, with its wave pool and large lawns, is a popular meeting spot.

**Events and Tours** Throughout the year, Grugapark hosts various events, such as the Parkleuchten in spring, where the park is illuminated in spectacular light effects in the evening, or the popular Christmas market in wintertime. Grugapark also offers thematic tours, including nature and bird watching, garden tours, and children's tours, providing educational insights into the fauna and flora.

**Arrival and Visitor Information** Grugapark is located near the fairgrounds and is easily accessible by public transport. There is a small entrance fee for visiting the park, and access to Grugabad is separately charged. Opening hours vary with the seasons, and additional entrance fees may apply for some events.

With its diverse landscape design, artistic elements, and numerous leisure facilities, Grugapark is a place for the whole family. It offers a break from everyday life, close to the city center, and is a must-visit for anyone wanting to experience the green side of Essen.



# Villa Hugel







Villa Hügel in Essen is one of the most impressive historical residences in Germany and a symbol of industrialization in the Ruhr area. The magnificent estate, located in the Bredeney district with a view of Lake Baldeney, was built in 1873 by Alfred Krupp, a significant steel industrialist, and served as the Krupp family's residence and representative seat for generations. With its 269 rooms and an area of about 8,100 square meters, Villa Hügel is an impressive combination of a residential home and a palace. The extensive park with centuries-old trees and manicured gardens invites visitors to stroll and forms a peaceful backdrop for the splendid architecture.

Today, Villa Hügel houses the Krupp Archive and a permanent exhibition on the history of the Krupp family and industrialization in the Ruhr area. Visitors can explore the historic living rooms and representative halls and delve into the world of the most influential industrial family of the 19th and 20th centuries. Villa Hügel is not only an architectural masterpiece but also a significant monument to industrial history and the rise of the Ruhr area.





## Baldeneysee

Baldeneysee is the largest of the six Ruhr reservoirs and a popular local recreation area in Essen. Created in the 1930s by damming the Ruhr River, it is scenically nestled in the southern part of Essen, surrounded by wooded hills and green landscapes.

The lake offers numerous recreational opportunities: water sports enthusiasts appreciate the lake for sailing, rowing, and stand-up paddling, while cyclists and walkers can enjoy nature on the approximately 14-kilometer-long lakeside path. In summer, the Seaside Beach Baldeney attracts visitors with its sandy beach and beach volleyball courts. Additionally, excursion boats offer tours of the lake, providing an opportunity to experience the surroundings from a new perspective.

With its proximity to Villa Hügel and good accessibility, Baldeneysee is an ideal place for a relaxing day in nature and a real highlight in the south of Essen.

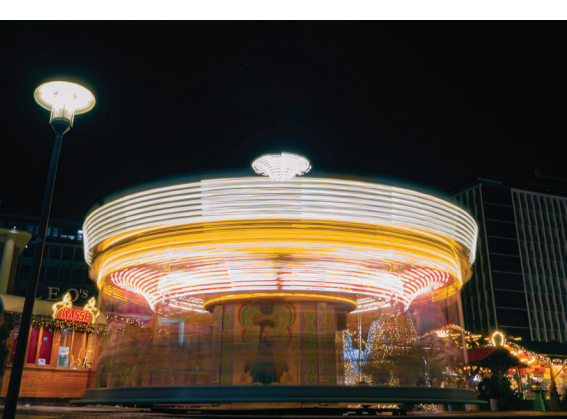
## Essen City Garden

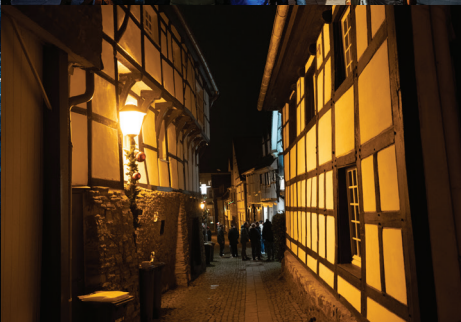
